

Part V - Counties

South Carolina is comprised of 46 counties, each with its own unique set of demographic, geographic, and political characteristics. These and other factors influence events within a county's borders. Using this information, planners can tailor specific countermeasures to the unique situation of a given county. Crime, economic activity, accidents and the subject of this book, traffic collisions are all affected by these characteristics. On the following pages, a summary of each county's traffic collision characteristics is provided. Among other facts, this data shows the following for 2001:

- ◆ Charleston County had the most traffic collisions with 10,502. This total was just slightly more than the number two county, Greenville (10,453).
- ◆ Greenville County had the most fatal collisions with 72 reported during the year followed by Spartanburg with 66. Greenville had the most traffic fatalities with 81. Spartanburg was second with 77 traffic fatalities.
- ◆ Charleston County had the most injury collisions and persons injured with 3,704 and 5,807 respectively in 2001. These totals were slightly more than the number two County, Richland, which had 2,936 injury crashes and 4,745 injuries.
- ◆ The high number of collisions in Greenville, Charleston and Richland Counties is largely a result of the large populations in each of these Counties
- ◆ The counties with the highest collision and fatality rates were the rural counties. Jasper County, for example, had 21 traffic fatalities in 2000. It ranked twenty-second among the 46 counties in the number of fatalities. However, its population death rate was 101.6 per 100,000 population, making it by far the leading County in the state.
