Seminar Description: David Harell retired from the Israeli Security Agency after 24 years of service in a number of counter-terrorism and protective security posts and has worked in the private sector for the past ten years. Mr. Harell will provide strategic solutions for security preparedness. He is internationally recognized as an expert on all aspects of security from emergency preparedness to crisis response plans. Participants will learn about suicide terrorism from several perspectives including adversary modus operandi; threat awareness; anti-terrorism doctrines; incident response; and pro-active methods to prevent an attack.

This training offers best practices based on actual field experience to enable effective incident response and a strong focus on current case studies of terror attacks to demonstrate required lessons to be learned. The course will also include a session on behavioral pattern recognition as a significant proactive tool for possible early identification of a suspect suicide bomber. Participants will be able to take concepts and tools taught during the course back to their agencies and examine how they can be used for preparing to meet the threat of suicide terrorism. The presentation will also provide participants with insights and characteristics of modern terrorism in order to gain a better understanding of the nature of the global and local threat.

This training will also provide a JTTF update and will highlight SLED's role in Homeland Security.

- All SC Law Enforcement (Including Chiefs, Sheriffs, Investigators and Line Officers—from the least experienced officers to the most experienced)
- Field Training Officers
- Front Line Officers
- Patrol Officers
- Campus Police
- Federal law enforcement agents

Registration Information: There is no fee for this class and law enforcement agencies are not limited as to the number of officers who can attend; however, all participants must be sworn law enforcement officers and employed by a bonafide law enforcement or public safety agency.
