#### **Seminar Description:**

These annual seminars are designed to address issues of mutual concern to both school personnel and law enforcement. This year's topics include:

- **Teen drug trends**—update, including how legalization of marijuana impacts schools.
- **Drug endangered children**—Risk factors and reporting requirements for school & law enforcement personnel.
- **Human trafficking awareness**—defining human trafficking, identifying human trafficking victims, and how educators and law enforcement should respond if they suspect a student may be such a victim.
- **Active shooter table top exercise**—focusing on dealing with the media at the staff level, reuniting students with parents, exactly what the faculty and staff are taught to do during an active shooter event, and several other items. The exercise is designed to incorporate blended teams of personnel, such as SROs, faculty, staff, and transportation officials from around the state, and will challenge individuals to improve their school's/district's standard operating procedures before, during, and after an active shooter event.
