The South Carolina Department of Public Safety, Office of Highway Safety and Justice Programs, is pleased to announce a combined solicitation for FFY 2015 criminal and juvenile justice grant programs. The Office of Highway Safety and Justice Programs will host a Grant Solicitation Workshop on Wednesday, November 5, 2014 at the Bill Rogers Community Connections Center at the S.C. Department of Juvenile Justice, located at 4900 Broad River Road in Columbia. A map is enclosed. The workshop will be held from 10:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., with registration beginning at 9:00.

The federal grant programs discussed in the workshop will include: Justice Assistance Grants; the Paul Coverdell Forensic Science Improvement Grant; the Juvenile Accountability Block Grant and the Juvenile Justice Formula Grants. All applications will be submitted via the Grants Management Information System (GMIS) at www.scdps.gov/ohsjp.

Please be aware that refreshments will not be provided or available for purchase at the workshop location; however, you are allowed to bring your own. 
